AI-2019 is the thirty-ninth Annual International Conference of the British Computer Society Specialist Group on Artificial Intelligence (SGAI). It will be held in the attractive surroundings of Peterhouse College, Cambridge.

This is the leading series of UK-based international conferences on Artificial Intelligence and the longest running AI conference series in Europe

December 17th

The first day of the conference will be devoted to a range of tutorials and workshops providing practical knowledge of recent developments in AI. On this day SGAI is hosting this year's UK CBR workshop. There are expected to be at least two other half-day workshops to provide greater depth in selected topics.

December 18th - 19th

The conference will run two parallel streams. The Technical Stream will present refereed papers on important recent technical developments. The Applications Stream will present refereed papers describing practical applications of AI. Both streams will include an invited keynote lecture by a leading expert. There will also be a panel discussion on a topical subject, an Open Microphone session and a Gala Dinner on the final evening.

Conference Proceedings

Accepted papers will be published by Springer in Lecture Notes in Artificial Intelligence (a sub-series of Lecture Notes in Computer Science) with the title *Artificial Intelligence XXXVI*. Expanded versions of the best papers from each stream will be reprinted as a special issue of an international journal.

Poster Sessions

The Poster Sessions are intended for the presentation of work which meets the high standards of the conference, but which is more topical and preliminary than the work presented in the main two streams. Papers submitted to either stream not deemed suitable for oral presentation in full form will be considered as posters. Poster papers will be included as short papers (6 pages) in the proceedings.
